
WEEPING AT THE FEET OF JESUS By Chaplain Paul Vescio

When I was in prison in 2009 my friend John and I came walking out onto the yard just after dark and we noticed that over by the basketball court there were a few men clapping their hands and singing and praising God so we decided to walk over and talk to them.

Now these guys, there were about seven of them it turns out were from Mexico and they were mighty men of God. At some point John began telling these Brothers in Christ about his illness. You see John had Hep-C because of tattoos he had gotten a few years back when he was home.

There is no cure for Hep-C all they can do for an inmate who is in prison is to monitor the person's enzymes in their liver. When things get really bad the inmate is sent to the hospital.

Well after hearing John's story these Brothers in Christ sat John down on the ground and made a circle around him and then began praying their hearts out for John for the glory of God. I mean when I tell you they were praying their hearts out I mean these guys were crying real tears of compassion for John, two of them were even on their knees. This went on for about 20 min or longer.

After we all prayed John and I walked back to our pod for the night. About a week later John had to go to medical to get his liver enzymes checked and to the shocking surprise of the medical team John's liver had reversed itself and was now repairing itself for the glory of God.

They told John that this had only happened three other times in that prison and guess what? Two of them were Brother Robert who was cured of his Hep-C and Brother Chooie who was not only cured of his Hep-C but was also cured of his diabetes as well by the laying of hands of the faithful Body of Christ at Kingman State Prison, and I have no doubt that the third inmate was a believer and follower of Christ Yeshua as well.

When we weep at the feet of Jesus for the sake of others in heartfelt prayer out of genuine compassion and love that is when real healing begins for the glory of God, not only for those who we are praying for but for each of us as well.

John 14:27 Peace I leave with you, My peace I give to you, not as the world gives do I give to you, let not your heart be troubled neither let it be afraid...Amen
